Message from Mrs Procter

There was great excitement this week as 16 new computers arrived in school. Weekly Reflection

Can you imagine you have been running in a race and you've just got to the end? You are tired, worn out and thirsty. Most people at that point would like a cold drink of water. We drink water throughout the day to help quench our thirst. Back in Jesus' time, it wasn't as easy to turn on a tap or get a bottle of water if you needed a drink. Walking a long way to a well and carrying it home was no easy job. In our Bible story this week, Jesus asked a lady at the well for a drink of water. Then He went on to say that He had water for her. Living water that would mean she would never go thirsty again. Jesus wasn't talking about water from a glass – He was revealing to the woman something much deeper that would change her entire life. Just as our bodies get thirsty, we can get spiritually thirsty too. We can thirst in our hearts for love and purpose and meaning. Jesus knew that the woman was thirsty for these things and when the woman heard Jesus she knew that He was right. Jesus' living water was a water that would never run out and would always satisfy her. Jesus was talking about himself. What makes it more incredible, is that Jesus gives all of us that same invitation. Whenever we are feeling troubled, finding things difficult or a little lost, we just need to ask Jesus to give us some of His living water and He will be there for us.

FS2 Trip to Imagine That!

Imagine that! We are going to an interactive museum as part of science week on Tuesday 28th March 2023. The trip will include a minimum of three science workshops. They have introduced some exciting new workshops for the new academic year, exploring the properties of solids and gases in an amazing visual experience. If that is not enough, we then get to explore all of the different areas: imagination village, creation area (we get to paint on cars!) and science investigation area (where we stand inside a giant bubble!).

Year 1 trip to Greenacres Farm

As part of our seasonal changes topic looking at spring animals, Year 1 will be going on a school trip on Friday 24th March to Greenacres Farm. Children will wear their **SCHOOL UNIFORM** due to class photographs in the morning. They will be provided with lunch and no extra money is required. Please pay **via ParentPay** the cost of the trip is £16.50, this will also be the consent for the trip.

Year 3 Stone Age Trip

Finally, on **Tuesday 21st March** Year 3 will get to go on their postponed trip to Tatton Park (let's hope there is no more snow!).

All of the activities will take place outside so we suggest that children wear plenty of layers and suitable footwear as the weather can be unpredictable. They will also need to ensure that they have a waterproof coat with a hood. They do not need to wear school uniform on this day. As the activities will include buildings shelters and other hands on tasks, we

suggest that children wear clothes that you **do not mind getting dirty**. We just want to reiterate that the children are **suitably dressed** for being outside all day. Last time, we had some very cold children and we only spent an hour or two outside. Children will need their packed lunch in a NAMED throw away bag and a water bottle. We ask that you are at school on time on this day so that we can get off as promptly as possible. We should be back in time for normal pick up but you will be informed if there are any hold ups on the day.

Year 3 Roman Trip to Chester

Year 3 will be going on a trip to the Grosvenor Museum in Chester on **Wednesday 19th April**. During this day they will discover why the Romans came to Britain and specifically Chester. They will look at real and replica artefacts, discuss archaelogy, building Roman Chester and the Roman World. The children will also carry shields and march through the city of Chester to the ampihtheatre for formations training. This will really support the work that they are covering on the Romans in class.



The price for this trip and transport will be £14.30. We have made this live on ParentPay. We ask that all monies be paid in full by Thursday 30th March (before we break up for Easter)

Year 5 Liverpool World Museum trip

During the summer term, Year 5 will be learning all about the Ancient Greeks as part of our history topic/ We have organised a trip to Liverpool World Museum where the children will take part in a workshop handling real and replica objects and become junior archeologists to understand people who lived in a significant and successful period of history. The children will need to wear full school uniform, a waterproof coat and bring a packed lunch. We will be travelling to and from Liverpool by train.
