How to choose a book... Our school reading focus this term is how to choose a book, to ensure children understand the best way to choose a book in the classroom, library or bookshop. We are focusing on this model:


LOOK - look at covers, what is the title who is the author?

BLURB - what does it tell you? Do you like the sound of the story?


THINK - What books do you enjoy? Is this a genre you are interested to try?

TRY- Open the book and have a read, Five-finger test: every time you come across a word you do not know, count a finger. If you get to five the book might be too hard.

ASK-Talk to your teacher, friend or family members to find out which books they recommend to you.
